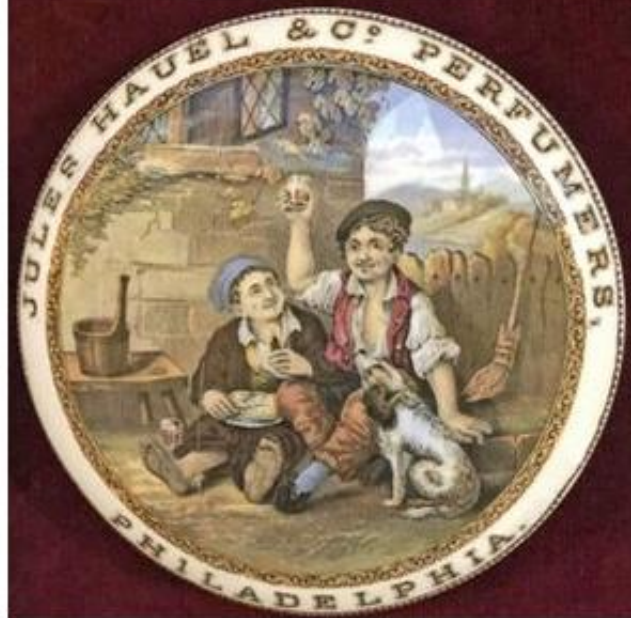

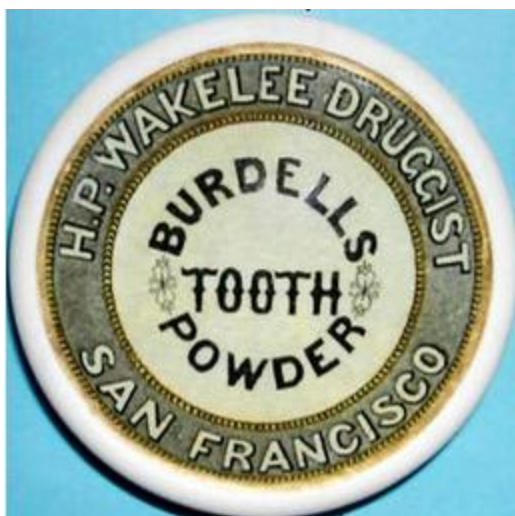

Dr. H. P. Wakelee, whose death in New York was noticed in the telegraphic columns yesterday, was a pioneer citizen of San Francisco and established a drug store near the corner of Sacramento and Montgomery streets as early as 1850. In 1863 he removed his business to the southeast corner of Sutter and Montgomery streets, and in 1865 he opened at the present location of Wakelee's Drug Store, on the southeast corner of Bush and Montgomery. He was also manager of the Golden City Chemical Works. The deceased was a fellow steamboat clerk with W. C. Ralston, on the Mississippi, before coming to California, and he embarked in a large number of that gentleman's ventures. When the Ralston smash came Mr. Wakelee's fortunes were completely ruined, so much so that he was obliged to part with his drug business to Randall Bros., and went to New York, some two or three years ago, to take a new start in life. The deceased was about sixty-five years of age at the time of his death and leaves a wife and daughter, who reside at 314 Ellis street, in this city. It is believed that his life is well insured.

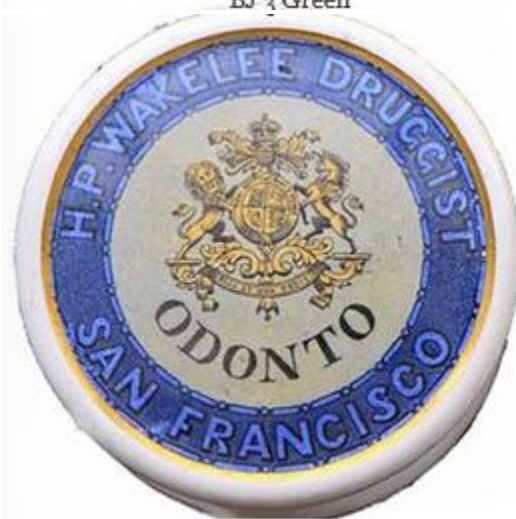

By 1884 Wakelee was no longer listed and C.W. and G.C. Randall are listed. In 1900 C.W. Randall & C.J. Sharon were listed still at 14 Montgomery St. In the later years the company was credited with manufacturing medical devices.

Good Advertising—

We have had occasion in the past to speak in this department of the character of the advertising matter issued by R. E. Rhode, of 504 North Clark Street, Chicago. We are now in receipt of two new specimens from Mr. Rhode's pharmacy. One is an aluminum pin tray, 3½ by 5 inches in size, and bearing a picture of the new Postoffice in Chicago with the words "Rhode's Pharmacy" underneath. The other is a good quality of pocket memorandum book. It is leather bound, and is of that variety which permits the note-book proper to slip out and another one to be substituted when the first has been used up. There is also a lead pencil and two pockets for cards, etc. The cover bears the legend in gold, "Compliments of R. E. Rhode, Chemist, Chicago," and four inside pages of the memorandum book are devoted to advertisements of Rhode's Kefir-Kumyss (one of Mr. Rhode's leading specialties), and several toilet preparations such as hair tonic, salicylated tooth and mouth wash, toilet lanolin cream, Cleopatra's lotion, and milk of cucumber

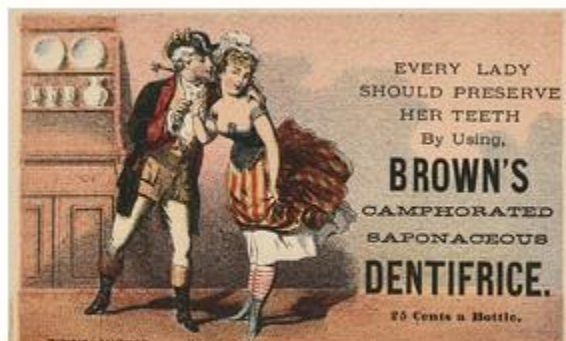

David Seymour Brown II was born in New York City on April 13, 1839. In 1872, he and his brother, Delphaine, succeeded their father in the family soapmaking business. David S. Brown & Co. was known for its "Satin Gloss" soap, a laundry soap having a pleasant perfume and priced low enough so that even the poorest could afford it. For many years, the company had its salesrooms and factory at the foot of Bank Street at the North (Hudson) River. In 1897, the city took over this property to build six piers for the White Star Line, and David S. Brown & Co. built new facilities along the North River between 51st and 52nd Streets.

In October 1894, David S. Brown purchased the plot on the southeast corner of Riverside Drive and West 102nd Street for \$105,000. He then commissioned architect Henry F. Kilburn to design a house for the irregularly-shaped property that measured 103 by 153 by 100 by 172 feet. A month later, on December 27, 1894, he married Florence Obendofer (1869-1937) at her home, located at 128 East 73rd Street. The Browns resided on Riverside Drive until 1910, when they moved to 881 West End Avenue. The Riverside Drive house was sold to a developer who built a 12-story apartment building on the site.

David S. Brown died at the age of 75 on June 19, 1914, in New York City.

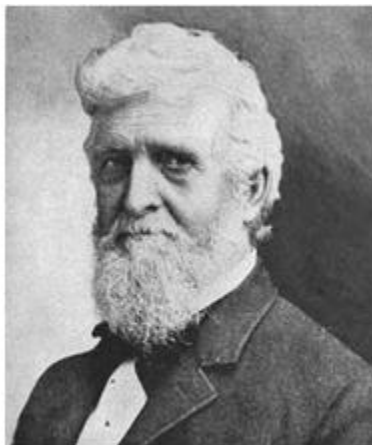

Dr. W. W. Allport

Walter Webb Allport was born in Lorain, New York, on June 10, 1824. He was a cousin of English railroad manager James Joseph Allport. Allport was raised on the family farm in Scriba, New York, often hauling wood to Oswego, New York. His father lost the farm in the Panic of 1837 and Walter was forced to leave home to make his own living at the age of fourteen. After working on a farm in Rodman, New York, he left for Watertown to learn a trade. He began to study medicine under Amasa Trowbridge in 1844, graduating two years later. He joined the dental firm of Denning & Robinson. In 1848, Allport left to become the junior partner with Dr. D. W. Perkins in Rome. He later practiced alone in Pulaski. Allport attended the New York College of Dental Surgery in 1852, graduating with a Doctor of Dental Surgery the next year.^[1]

In 1854, Allport decided to move west to take advantage of the growing population of Chicago, Illinois. He founded an office at 144 Lake Street, sharing the space with a physician. Allport rented a barber's chair by the month to use as an operating chair. In May 1855, he moved to 75 Clark Street, then two years later to 32 Washington Street. His clientele rapidly grew as Allport was one of the only dentists to know how to use crystal gold for fillings. He was elected Corresponding Secretary of the American Dental Convention in 1856. Two years later, he was elected president of the Western Dental Society. The next year, he was president of the convention that founded the American Dental Association at Niagara Falls, New York. He was elected first chairman of the organization in 1860. With Dr. S. T. Creighton, he began publishing the *People's Dental Journal* in January 1863, which ran for two years.^[1]

Allport helped to organize the Chicago Dental Association in 1864. In 1865, Allport was named president of the American Dental Convention and became a charter member of the Illinois State Dental Society. Allport occasionally lectured at Rush Medical College and was named an emeritus professor of that institution. Rush awarded him an honorary Doctor of Medicine (MD) in 1881. He co-founded the Chicago Dental Infirmary in 1883. The school was organized to provide students with an MD degree and an opportunity to also pursue a Doctor of Dental Surgery. The school was unsuccessful, and a year later the institution dropped its MD requirement and was renamed the Chicago College of Dental Surgery. Allport remained as a director.^[1]

Allport was elected president of the American Dental Association in 1885. He was vice president of the 9th International Medical Congress in 1887, where he co-founded the dental section. At the congress, he also successfully petitioned the American Medical Association to allow dentists to join the organization; this was later overturned. He led the effort to found the World's Columbian Dental Congress for the 1893 World's Columbian Exposition.^[1]

On December 24, 1847, Allport married Sarah Maria Haddock. They had three sons and one daughter. All three sons became physicians. In 1858, Allport designed the first dental registering ledger, featuring diagrams of the teeth for easy identification. The ledger was used by other dentists in the following decades. Allport was an early advocate of the use of crystalline gold and dental dams. He co-founded the Chicago Microscopical Club in 1868 and was its first president. He attended Grace Episcopal Church and was a Mason. Allport died on March 21, 1893, from meningitis. He was buried in Graceland Cemetery.^[1]

The origins of the Vinolia Company lie in a perfumers, toilet soap & toilet preparations maker, Blondeau et Cie, which was founded in 1885 by Dr Eggleston Burrows & James Hill Harbridge, with premises in New Bond Street, London. The brand name Vinolia was adopted for the company's toiletries range, including soap, cream & powder advertised as suited to sensitive skin conditions. Factories were established in Kentish Town & other parts of London.

In 1898 the Vinolia Company was formed as a limited liability company to take over the business of Blondeau et Cie, & in 1899 it was incorporated as a public company, to acquire the business of this previous Vinolia Company. In 1900 the company achieved the accolade of a Royal Warrant as soapmakers to Queen Victoria. The company was acquired by Lever Brothers on 1 October 1906 & 1907 production of the Vinolia range was transferred to the Lever Brothers' factory in Port Sunlight. On 24 September 1915 another company, Blondeau et Cie, was formed to work in conjunction with the Vinolia Company, apparently to preserve certain patent rights belonging to the original concern of Blondeau et Cie. By the end of the nineteenth century the Vinolia range included eau de cologne, brillantines for the hair, toilet soap and powder, dentifrice, shaving sticks and a lip-salve that was to prove its most enduring product: Vinolia Lypsyli. By 1920 the Vinolia range also included toothpaste and bath salts, a baby range of soap and powder, and a range of speciality perfumes called the 'cut flower series', including such fragrances as English Rose and Russian Violets, Aralys, Osiris and Sourire d'été contained in crystal-cut glass bottles.

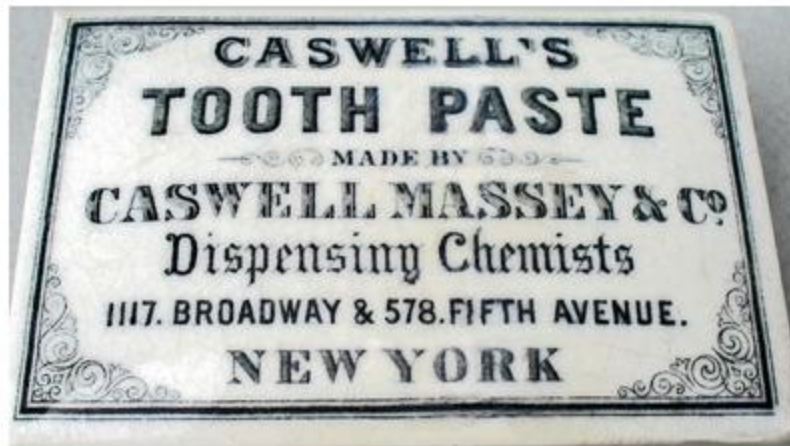

Caswell-Massey, founded in 1752, is the first fragrance and personal care product company in America. Originally, Caswell Massey started as an apothecary shop in Newport, Rhode Island, by a Scottish-born doctor named William Hunter.^[1] The main product categories include fine-fragrance, soap, bath & body products, men's shaving products and *toiletries* and other assorted apothecary-style personal care accessories. Its products were preferred favorites of notable historical figures such as John F. Kennedy, George Washington, Cole Porter, Alla Nazimova, John Denver, and The Rolling Stones.

The company is regarded as the fourth-oldest continuously operating company in America and the oldest American consumer brand in operation. The current motto of Caswell-Massey is "America's Original".

Dr. William Hunter established Dr. Hunter's Dispensary in Newport in 1752. Caswell Massey began as an apothecary shop selling medical supplies. Hunter gave the first lectures on anatomy and surgery in the Colonies in 1755. During that time, he also invented orange soda to help his customers take the medicines sold in his apothecary shop.

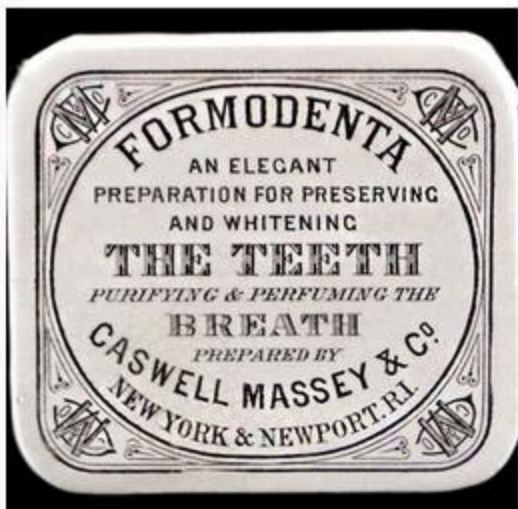
Newport, Rhode Island, at the time, was a destination for the social elite to buy European-style luxuries. While selling medical products, Dr. Hunter also began selling cosmetic, personal care, and hygiene products and developed a business in medicinal essential oils, such as lavender and verbena. He also imported fragrances from Europe, and blended 20 of his own different colognes, numbered One through Twenty; Dr. Hunter's Cologne Number Six was often purchased by George Washington and was given as a gift by the President to the Marquis de Lafayette, and thereby became very popular among many politicians and intellectuals in early American society after Independence. During the same time, White Rose perfume was introduced for women and became a favorite of Dolley Madison, who was rumored to bathe in the perfume. The shop was also known for its very high-quality Castile soap, which was purchased by Lewis and Clark for their Western expedition.

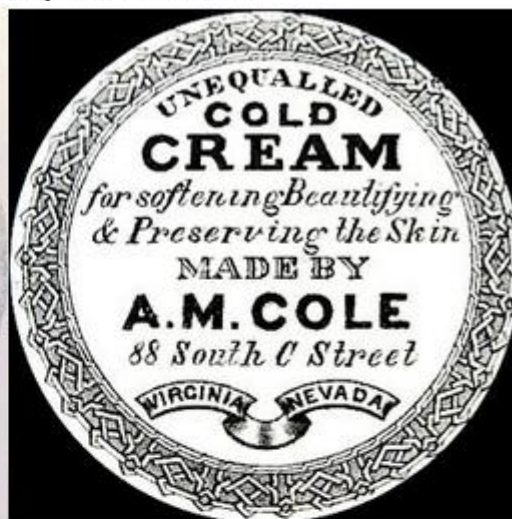
Misbranding of the article was alleged in the information for the reason that the following statements regarding the therapeutic or curative effects thereof, included in the circular or pamphlet aforesaid, to wit, "Tarrant's Compound Extract of Cubebs and Copaiba. A * * * certain, * * * remedy for Gonorrhœa, Gleet, Whites, Incipient Stricture, * * * Pyelitis * * *," were false and fraudulent in that they were applied to the article knowingly, and in reckless and wanton disregard of their truth or falsity, so as to represent falsely and fraudulently to the purchasers thereof, and create in the minds of purchasers thereof the impression and belief, that it was, in whole or in part, composed of, or contained, ingredients or medicinal agents effective, among other things, as a certain remedy for gonorrhea and gleet, as a remedy for whites, incipient strictures, and pyelitis, when, in truth and in fact, it was not, in whole or in part, composed of, and did not contain, such ingredients or medicinal agents.

On December 3, 1915, the defendant company entered a plea of guilty to the information, and the court imposed a fine of \$25.

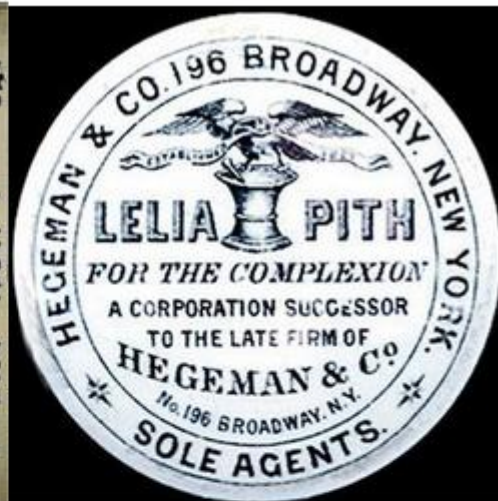

A.M. Cole- Born in New York in 1833, Allan M. Cole arrived in California in the early 1850's and began his druggist career in Petaluma, California. In the 1850's, with the discovery of the Comstock Lode in Nevada Territory, he became the pioneer druggist of Virginia City and remained there until his death in 1913. Cole was one of the few early western region druggists who produced a pictorial potlid for his product line. It dates from the late 1870's.
